BAPTISM:

Third Sunday of the Month. Arrangements must be made at the Rectory at least two weeks in advance. Sponsors must be practicing Catholics. Parents, and also godparents when possible, must meet with the priest for a Conference before Baptism.

Saturday afternoons 4:30 to 5:15 pm, and anytime at the Rectory.

MARRIAGES:

Arrangements should be made at least six months in advance at the rectory to ensure the date and the hour desired. The Nuptial Mass is the ordinary form of celebrating Christian marriage, and should be strongly considered when making Wedding plans. Attendance at the Pre-Cana Conferences, or the equivalent, is required by the Archbishop.

St. Patrick's Day is important in New York., because Patrick is the patron of the Archdiocese of New York. On that day we honor our patron and ask his intercession for the work of the church. To celebrate that day, I have asked Kitty Sullivan to present her one-woman show, Ireland Once Upon a Time, on Sunday, March 22, at 2:30pm in the church. I hope you will join us for an afternoon of harp, verse, song and storytelling. After the presentation, hopefully you'll join us in the rectory for a little bit of soda bread, coffee (Irish or not) or tea. Kitty will present the program in honor of her good friend, Donna de Solis.

I'm delighted to report that work on the church façade is moving ahead. Our Buildings and Grounds Committee, to whom we all owe a great deal of thanks, has spent a lot of time and effort working out the details. I'll keep you posted. Work, I am told, will begin when the weather begins to be 36 degrees and rising.

Viva la tavola di San Giuse!~ The feast of St. Joseph will take place this year on Thursday, March 19th. St Joseph's day is a big Feast for Italians because in the Middle Ages, God, through St. Joseph's intercessions, saved the Sicilians from a very serious drought. So in his honor, the custom is for all to wear red, in the same way that green is worn on St. Patrick's Day. Maybe you can drop by the church that day, on your way to or from work, and say a little prayer to St. Joseph..

Just a reminder in the hope that you will plan accordingly. There is no holier time in the church—no more important celebration than the Paschal Triduum. Lent ends on the Holy Thursday night at 7:30pm, when the Triduum begins with the Liturgy of the Lord's Supper and continues through the Liturgy of the Lord's Suffering and Dying on Good Friday concluding with the Easter Vigil and Celebration of the Resurrection of Saturday night. It is all one ceremony—on Thursday night we begin with the sign of the cross which opens all our prayers—the blessing that ends every Mass, is given on Saturday night. One prayer—hopefully you will plan to take part.
