BAPTISM:

Arrangements must be made at the Rectory. Sponsors must be practicing Catholics. Parents, and also godparents when possible, must attend the Pre-Baptismal conference which is held on the 1st Tuesday of every month at 7:30pm in the rectory. During Lent the sacrament of Baptism will be celebrated only in an emergency situation.

CONFESSIONS:

Saturday afternoons 4:30 to 5:15 pm, and anytime at the Rectory.

MARRIAGES:

Arrangements should be made at least six months in advance at the rectory to ensure the date and the hour desired. The Nuptial Mass is the ordinary form of celebrating Christian marriage, and should be strongly considered when making Wedding plans. Attendance at the Pre-Cana Conferences, or the equivalent, is required by the Archbishop.

NEW PARISHIONERS:

We welcome new parishioners, and invite them to register at the Rectory. The registration is our only means of certifying anyone as a member of our parish. If you move to another Parish, or change your address within the Parish, please notify us.

FATIMA DEVOTIONS:

The Rosary is said daily after the 12:10 pm Mass. Friday from 6-7 pm there is a holy hour.

BENEDICTION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT:

First Friday - Exposition: 12:35 pm. Adoration: All day; Benediction: 5:15 PM.

MIRACULOUS MEDAL NOVENA:

Mondays, before the 12:10 Mass and before the 5:30 pm Mass.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION FOR CHILDREN AND TEENAGERS:

Classes in Religion for Catholic children/teenagers, Prekindergarten - High School take place on Sundays. The Family Mass begins at 10:00 a.m. in the Church followed by class instruction in the school.

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

Thank you to all who enabled our celebrations of Holy Week, Palm Sunday, the Pascal Triduum (the Liturgy of the Lord's Last Supper, the Suffering and Dying of the Lord, the Great Easter Vigil). All our Easter Sunday celebrations were so wonderful and alive.

A special word of thanks to Marlon Hosang, the altar server, who was so well prepared and so prayerful, the Lectors who proclaimed the Word with great dignity and the Ministers of the Eucharist who as always offers the Body and Blood of Christ to us with such grace.

Our choir enabled us to better lift our minds to God – thanks to Gregory D'Agostino our music director and the choir he conducts, to Jim Trainor and the 5:30pm Mass choir and the Spanish choir.

Thanks to Thomas Davis for coordinating the decorating of the church.

Our parish maintenance staff truly excelled in keeping the church clean and safe.

My thanks go out to the office staff who laid out and printed and assembled the music program.

Thanks to Junior Santiago for all you do behind the scenes.

Nothing happens in Blessed Sacrament without the involvement of so many people.

Parents who were to present for their child for baptism are reminded of the Baptismal Preparation Conference to be held on Tuesday of this week at 7:30pm.

Month of the Holy Eucharist. During the month of April, we give special honor to the Holy Eucharist. The Eucharist, the Second Vatican Council taught us, is "the source and summit o the Christian life" (Lumen gentium, 11). What does that mean? It means that our participation in the Eucharist is the source from which we draw our strength to live as Jesus taught and to serve in his name. It is also the summit, the high point of our communal life.

We use the word Eucharist to describe our celebration of the Mass. We use the same word when we speak of the Sacrament of Christ's Body and Blood. In this month of the Holy Eucharist, let us participate more fully and actively in the Church's liturgy, our celebration of the Eucharist. And let us take time, too, for quiet adoration in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, and become more aware of the wondrous way Christ comes to us in the Eucharist.

Divine Mercy Sunday. The Sunday of Divine Mercy is a day established by Pope John Paul II as "a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face with confidence in divine benevolence the difficulties and trials that humankind will experience in years to come" (Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, May 23, 2000). In a way similar to Passion Sunday (Palm Sunday) or the Fourth Sunday of Easter (Good Shepherd Sunday), the Second Sunday of Easter bears the additional title of Sunday of Divine Mercy.

This is not a new solemnity or feast, nor does it celebrate a new or separate mystery of redemption, but rather, it leads into continuing celebration of God's mercy during Easter Time. As the Octave Day of Easter, the Lectionary readings and prayer texts highlight the mystery of divine compassion that underlies the Church's Easter faith.

Feast of the Annunciation. Through the angel Gabriel, the Spirit of God comes to Mary in the most unfeasible way, asking the impossible. As a young woman engaged to be married, being found pregnant would have meant her death in the culture at the time. She risks hurting Joseph, bringing shame on their families, and setting herself up for execution, because she is sure of one thing: God calls her mother to the Son of God. Mary is special because her faith is stronger than her fear. She does not see the road ahead but knows that God wills for her to journey it nonetheless. Trusting in God above all, she consents her will, becoming the first and most important vessel of bringing Christ's presence into the world.

Pray for peace in this Year of Mercy. Fr. Duffell

Se usa la palabra Eucaristía para describir la celebración de la Misa. También cuando se habla del Sacramento del Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo. Durante este mes participemos mas activamente en la liturgia de la Iglesia. Y encontremos el momento para adorar tranquilamente en la presencia del Santísimo Sacramento y de estar mas consiente de como Cristo llega a nosotros en la Eucaristía.

Domingo de la Merced Divina. Es una día establecido por el Papa Juan Pablo II como una "invitación permanente al mundo Cristiano para enfrentar con confianza y benevolencia divina las dificultades que experimentara la humanidad en tiempos aun por venir" ("Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments"), May 23, 2000). Algo similar al Domingo de Pasión (Domingo de Palmas) o al 4to Domingo de Pascua (Domingo del Buen Pastor), el Segundo Domingo de Pascua tiene también el nombre de Domingo de la Merced Divina.

No es una nueva solemnidad o fiesta ni tampoco celebra un misterio separado de redención, sino una continua celebración de la gracia de Dios durante el Tiempo Pascual. En este día las Lecturas y plegarias enfatizan el misterio de la compasión divina que refuerza la Fe Pascual de la Iglesia.

On Friday, March 18, a group of over 15 Blessed Sacrament Parishioners, led by the Social Action Committee, attended a panel discussion on solitary confinement, hosted by the National Religious Campaign Against Torture.

The discussion not only highlighted the inhumane and horrific practices taking place in prisons around the country, but also underscored the ineffectiveness of solitary confinement, and the danger it poses inside and outside of prison walls. Prisoners can be left for years to serve out their sentences in solitary confinement - cruel and damaging conditions with no access to rehabilitative programs. Upon release, they re-join society as tortured individuals, a safety risk for us all.

The HALT bill, designed to end solitary confinement in New York State, is currently moving through the state legislature. The Blessed Sacrament Social Action Committee firmly believes solitary confinement is torture, and remains committed to following this cause and contributing our efforts to the passage of this bill.
