Attendance at the Pre-Cana Conferences, or the equivalent, is required by the Archbishop.

### **PARISH NOTES**

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

On this Thursday, we celebrate the Feast of St. Francis Xavier Cabrini, Mother Cabrini - the great immigrant saint.

Recently, a priest friend of mine said: Last Sunday, I held a woman in my arms as she shook with tears. On Monday, she would learn whether her husband would be deported to Mexico – not for any crime, per se, but simply for lack of legal status. At that moment, I must confess words failed me but words do not fail me now. The faith community has a simple and direct message for you: Stop the deportations. Stop the real violence these deportations are doing to wives, to husbands, to children, and communities here and throughout the world.

I would ask the President to remind us of the hope he once embodied. Call on all our leaders to make a recommitment to its fundamental values. Stop the deportations. Liberate our brothers and sisters from the slavery of fear in which they now live

### MAKING ALL THINGS NEW-

Important Changes Announced

Based on the input Cardinal Dolan received from the 368 parishes in the Archdiocese and 75 parish clusters; a 40 person advisory committee comprised of clergy, religious men and women, and the faithful from across the archdiocese; the priest council; other close advisors and key staff, he has decided that: All parishes will work together more collaboratively within their clusters in providing services and ministries.

48 parishes will merge with a nearby parish, resulting in 24 new parishes, with Masses and sacraments celebrated at both churches. There will be an evaluation every two years of these newly merged parishes, and every parish throughout the archdiocese. To accomplish this, the archdiocese has established a parish planning office, to be directed by Eileen Mulcahy.

64 parishes will merge with a nearby parish, resulting in 31 new parishes, and while this new parish will have two churches, Masses and sacraments will only be celebrated on a regular basis at one church as of August 1, 2015.


